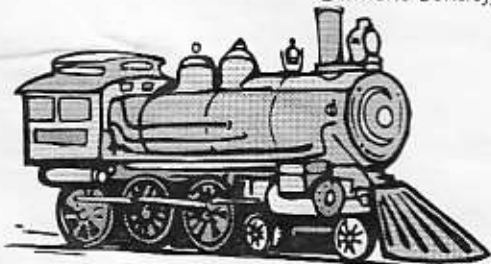
As most already know, we lost Frank DiNunzio—he was missed by all. Joining us in his place was Lee Moyer and his one-man-band. Thanks Lee!

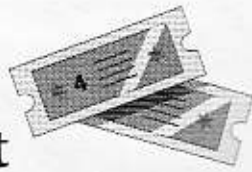
Dear Friends of Old Annville,

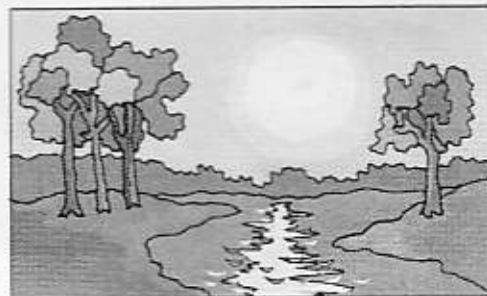
Historic Home for Sale

An historic home on the 400th block of W. Main Street, Annville is to be sold at auction in the near future. It is rumored that the building at one time was the "Shalley Hotel," dating back to 1785. It is believed that Lucas Schalle owned the property while Christian Cassel operated it as a public house. Tradition locates the Shalley Hotel at 447-449 W. Main Street. However, records only link Christian Cassel with homes near 213-17 W. Main Street, not 447-449. It seems the buyer of this beautiful, historic home on W. Main Street will also become the owner of a rich and entangled history just waiting to be researched.
